Bill Boudouris grew up in Scouting; he participated in Cub Scouts and joined Troop 159 in Sylvania, OH with four of his cousins. Bill achieved Eagle Scout in December of 1973.

Bill returned to Scouting in 2000 when his oldest son joined Cub Scouts. Since then, Bill has been active volunteer participating in Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturing along with his four sons. Two of his sons earned Eagle Scout and a third is on track to achieve Eagle Scout in 2018.

Bill has contributed to the Scouting movement through a variety of positions at the unit, district, and council level.

He served once as Tiger Den Leader and twice as Wolf, Bear, and Webelos Den Leaders. He also served as Cubmaster and Pack Committee Chair.

In Boy Scouts he served as Merit Badge Counselor, Committee Member, Assistant Scout Master, Troop Committee Chair, Sea Base Crew Advisor (twice).
