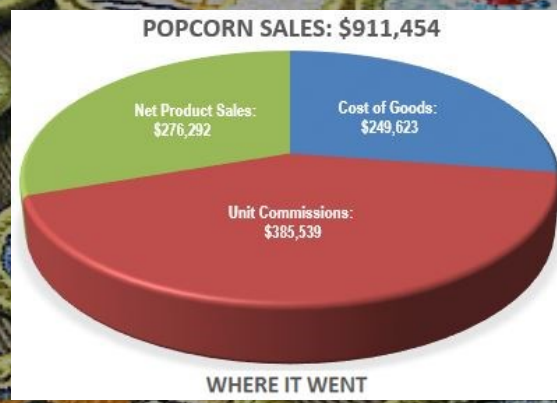
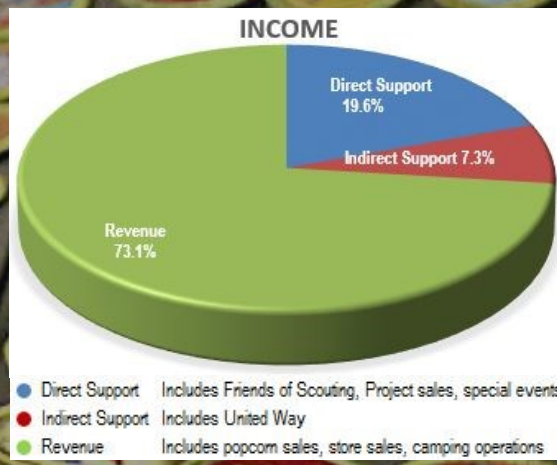

EAGLE SCOUT CLASS OF 2017

Eagle Scout is the highest achievement or rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program of the Boy Scouts of America. The designation "Eagle Scout" was founded over 100 years ago. Only four percent of Boy Scouts are granted this rank after a lengthy review process. The requirements necessary to achieve this rank take years to fulfill. The Eagle Scout rank has been earned by almost 2.5 million young men.

Requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges. The Eagle Scout must demonstrate Scout Spirit, an ideal attitude based upon the Scout Oath and Law, service, and leadership. This includes a large leadership service project that he plans, organizes, leads, and manages.

Eagle Scouts are presented with a medal and a badge that visibly recognizes the accomplishment. Additional recognition can be earned through Eagle Palms, awarded for completing additional tenure, leadership, and merit badge requirements.

The Distinguished Eagle Scout Award is a distinguished service award of the Boy Scouts of America. It is awarded to an Eagle Scout for distinguished service in his profession and to his community for a period of at least 25 years after attaining the level of Eagle Scout.

Other requirements include significant accomplishment in one's career and a solid record of continued community volunteer involvement. It is one of only two BSA awards given to adults that is dependent upon the recipient's having been awarded Eagle Scout as a youth; the other is the NESAs Outstanding Eagle Scout Award.

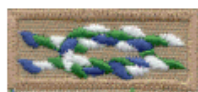


WILLIAM T. HORNADAY AWARDS

JAMES E. WEST FELLOWSHIPS



James E. West (1876-1948) was the first Chief Scout Executive. He agreed to take the job for up to six months and stayed on for 32 years.

A gift to our local council, designated by the donor to the council endowment fund, qualifies for membership as a James E. West fellow. The gift must be in addition to—and not replace or diminish—the donor’s annual Friends of Scouting support. A minimum gift of \$1,000 in cash or marketable securities qualifies for the Bronze level membership.

Donors may make cumulative gifts to reach Silver, Gold, and Diamond member levels. For example, five years of giving at the Bronze level would qualify for Silver level membership. Many individuals and corporations make these gifts either on behalf of someone else—such as in honor of an Eagle Scout, Silver Beaver recipient, a retirement, a special accomplishment, or anniversary—or in memory of a special individual.

THE SILVER BEAVER AWARD

As a movement whose leadership is overwhelmingly volunteer, the Boy Scouts of America recognizes the need to acknowledge the invaluable service that men and women render to youth.

The Silver Beaver is the highest honor that a Council can bestow upon a volunteer and is among the most prestigious awards in Scouting.

The Silver Beaver Award was introduced in 1931 as a means for Council-level recognition of Scouters who provided distinguished service to youth.

The Silver Beaver is not an “earned” award; rather the recognition is granted by one’s own peers in Scouting for distinguished service to youth.

A Council committee selects the recipients after a thorough review of nominations received from throughout the Council. The National Council, upon the recommendation of the local Council, makes the award.

Time of service is not a prerequisite; nor does the fact that someone is long-tenured make the recognition automatic.

A recipient of the award may be a Scouter who has given exceptional service to Scouting or his/her community over a long period of time, or it may go to a Scouter who has done a single truly remarkable act of noteworthy service.

The award may also be presented to Scouters who provide exceptional service to youth outside of Scouting.

Dave began his Scouting life by marching in the Bicentennial parade as a Cub Scout in Alexandria, VA. His mother was his Den Leader.

He continued in Scouting through high school where he performed in a unicycle show group, played in marching band, was a varsity wrestler, and restored a 1967 Mustang. He and

his twin brother, Dan, earned Eagle Scout in 1984 while his father was Scoutmaster. Dave was a Brotherhood member of Amangamek Wipit Lodge.

During summer breaks from Virginia Tech, Dave returned to work with his troop as an Assistant Scoutmaster. While at Tech, he was avidly involved with the Marching Virginians. In fact, he met his wife when she ran into him on the field.

After graduation, Dave went on to the Culinary Institute of America and worked as a chef in Northern VA. For the last 15 years, Dave has been a Class A contractor. He recently earned his Master of Education in Instructional Design and Technology and will change careers again shortly.

2018 SILVER BEAVER RECIPIENT

Bill Boudouris grew up in Scouting; he participated in Cub Scouts and joined Troop 159 in Sylvania, OH with four of his cousins. He became an Eagle Scout in December 1973.

Bill returned to Scouting in 2000 when his oldest son joined Cub Scouts. Since then, Bill has been an active volunteer participating in Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturing along with his four sons. Two of his sons earned Eagle Scout and a third is on track to achieve Eagle Scout in 2018.

Bill has contributed to the Scouting movement through a variety of positions at the unit, district, and council level.

CHARLES “CHUCK” KUBIC 2018 SILVER BEAVER RECIPIENT



Chuck Kubic became a Cub Scout in Pack 14 in his hometown of Greensburg, PA in 1958. He built three “pretty good” Pinewood Derby cars and earned the Parvuli Dei Award and the Arrow of Light before crossing over to Troop 14.

As a Boy Scout, Chuck was a Patrol Leader, served as Troop Scribe and attended the 1964 National Jamboree in Valley Forge with 50,000 new Scout friends. He earned the Ad Altare Dei award and was elected to the Order of the Arrow (OA). He completed his Ordeal and became a Brotherhood member in Wagon Lodge #6.

Chuck spent his high school Scouting years with “high adventure” Explorer Post 414 during which time he made a Philmont Expedition as a Crew Leader, became a white-water canoeing expert, advanced “along the trail” to Eagle Scout, and served as Post Secretary-Treasury, Vice President and President.

As a young Navy Ensign, after graduating with a Civil Engineering degree from Lehigh University, Chuck served as the Scoutmaster for a multi-national BSA Troop at the American School in Thailand. He became the Advisor of the Bangkok OA Chapter of the Hinode Goya Lodge #498, which maintained its council fire less than 2 miles from the historic “Bridge on the River Kwai.”

Later in his Navy career, Chuck became a Tiger Cub parent and then Cubmaster of the Pack at the International School in Madrid, Spain. When he returned to the U.S., he began service as a Webelos Den Leader and then Cubmaster in Annandale, VA. While there, he also served as an Assistant Scoutmaster and was a member of the Amangamek Wipit OA Lodge #470.

Blue Heron achieved Gold status in the annual Journey to Excellence competition. It also won the OA Southern Region's "We Support Camping" award.

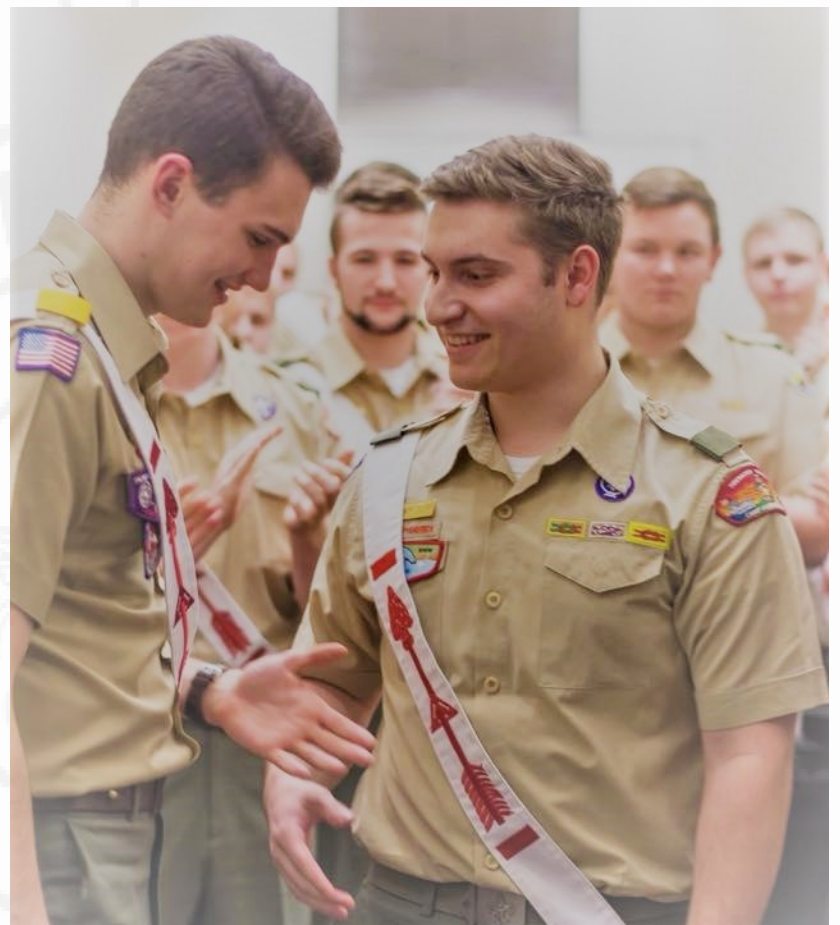
Founders Award recipients were Will Scheib and Brendan Switts. Silver Heron Awards went to Justin Chesnut and Daniel McCloud,
