A. Merit Badge University (MBU)

Registration

The fee is \$7 per Scout, FREE for MBU Staff (MBCs & Support Staff), and \$3 for each adult, whether you plan to attend one or both days. (For the required insurance, ALL adults staying on premises, whether merit badge counselors (MBCs), MBU staff, or adults accompanying their unit's Scouts, will need to register.) If you register as Staff, please expect to be tasked. Youth staff need to be registered Scouting youth (Boy Scouts, Venturers, etc.) of at least 16 years of age. Registration is open August 10, 2018 through September 12, 2018, or until we reach capacity. Scouts from other Districts and Councils may register starting August 17, 2018 if space is still available. Scouts must register in advance through their Unit.

Only accepting online registration and payment upon sign up is required, you are not registered until payment is complete.

How to Register

- 1. Units are asked to provide one adult staff volunteer (Parent/Leader/MBC) for every 5 Scouts attending to assist as needed at MBU.
- 2. Scoutmasters briefs Scouts and parents about MBU and current available MB choices.
- 3. Scoutmasters should check the online site (Tentaroo https://tidewater.tentaroo.com/) for final MB list on August 10, 2018, then brief Scouts and parents of any additional available MB choices.
- 4. Scoutmasters should register their Scouts as a unit.
- 5. Scouts fill out MB Applications (Blue Cards)
- 6. Scoutmaster reviews and signs MB Applications (Blue Cards)
- 7. Scouts bring signed MB Applications (Blue Cards), MB pamphlets (optional), and any documentation of requirements previously completed for MB to their MB sessions.

Note 1: The MBU staff recommend using a unit meeting to read and explain the application process. The unit should use a single adult member to manage the registration. This helps ensure that no one is missed.

Note 2: Blue cards are an important record and may be the only record a Scout has of completing a merit badge. Scouts should take extra care when filling out their blue cards to make sure they are legible and completed properly. Blue cards MUST be signed by the Scoutmaster or designated unit leader. Also, the Scout MUST bring the signed blue card with him on the first day of MBU. MBCs have the right to turn away Scouts with incomplete Blue Cards.

Refund Policy

In cases of death of an immediate family member, sickness or injury, or military transfer, we will refund all but \$5 of fees paid until September 8, 2018 when verified by a physician, military commander, or such official. Reasons such as vacation schedule, school programs, and last minute changes of mind are not acceptable reasons for refunds. Scout deposits are transferrable within a unit, but are not refundable. After September 8, 2018, no refunds are available for any reason.

We hope to offer a full program for our Scouts, but we can only be successful with the generous help of our volunteers. Units with a volunteering registered MBC by August 1, 2018 will be given the final MB list before registration opens on August 10, 2018. This will allow those units the ability to be ready to register their youth when the registration opens on August 10, 2018; this also applies to units outside the Three Rivers District and Tidewater Council that have volunteering registered MBCs.

III. Program

A. Badges Available

Listed below are a few MBs for which we currently have MBCs. (Eagle-required are in **Bold**). An updated list will be provided by August 10, 2018. Units will be able to select and register for available MBs online. Due to popularity and limited availability of MBCs, some will fill up quickly. Units who register early have the best chance of getting the desired MBs for their Scouts.

Please review all the requirements for the MBs for which you are registered, before the MBU.

Requirements not covered: Review these requirements prior to attending MBU, as they will not be covered on the day of MBU. To earn a completed MB at the end of MBU, Scouts are encouraged to complete them and bring the documentation to their MBC on the day of MBU. B. Effective Revision of Requirements and Merit Badge Pamphlets

Those Scouts starting and completing any badges at MBU must use the requirements listed in the 2018 Requirement Book.

Several merit badges, such as Personal Management, require at least three months of effort. Scouts are encouraged to begin work on those long-duration requirements immediately; however, the Scout may complete those requirements with a MBC at a later date. For MBU, please review the MB list above.

C. Homework

Scouts may be expected to complete requirements between sessions. The Scout is responsible for completing his requirements for the MB.

D. Field Trips / Offsite instruction

Occasionally, Scouts may need to participate in a scheduled field trip for the completion of a particular merit badge. If that occurs, a special permission slip will be provided, and parents will be responsible for furnishing transportation. Some MBs may be offered at remote sites away from the main campus of MBU. Scouts enrolled in these off-site MBs will be provided with special instructions by their counselor.

E. Extra Fees

Some MBs might require specials supplies which might need to be either provided by the Scout or require special fees. We hope to build these fees (if any) into the online registration. Scouts needing to bring any special supplies for a MB will be provided with special instructions by their counselor.

F. Partial Completion

If a Scout is unable to complete his merit badge, the "PARTIAL" completion will be noted on his blue card. Please review the above merit badge chart for MB requirements.

Partial efforts will result in partial completions

Consult with your MBC for ways to earn a completed MB after MBU is over.

IV. Conduct and Discipline

As a participant of the MBU, I will:

- Observe the Scout Oath and Scout Law
- Wear my official field uniform over my activity shirt
- Attend the classes to which I am assigned
- Be personally responsible for breakage, damage, or loss of property
- Be courteous to other Scouts, counselors, and staff
- Not run or participate in horse playing inside the building
- Clean up my classroom at the end of each session
- Clean up my trash after eating a snack or lunch

V. Uniforms

Scouts are encouraged to wear the official field uniform for MBU. Some units call this a "Class A" uniform. Please wear your official field uniform over your activity shirt. Some units call the activity shirt a "Class B" uniform.

VI. Snacks and Lunch

<u>Lunch is not included in the registration payment.</u> Food may be purchased on site at a cost of no more than \$5 per session. Scouts may plan to purchase food & drink from this offering or they should bring their own lunch. Scouts should bring a water bottle, to stay hydrated during MB sessions. All food must be consumed in the designated area. No food or drink is permitted inside the church building unless an exception is made by the MBU staff for reasons such as inclement weather. **Scouts are expected to clean up after themselves.**

VII. Health, Safety, and First Aid

- Participants are responsible for their own medications during the event.
- No running inside or outside the building
- No roller blades, roller shoes, roller skates, Heelys, or Skateboards are allowed
- No alcohol, illegal drugs, fireworks, firearms, slingshots, or anything else that might distract from the learning environment. No tobacco products are permitted
- The Buddy System is mandatory during sessions. Bathroom breaks during sessions must be with a buddy.
- The MBU First Aid station is at the Administration table.

VIII. Lost and Found

HOW DO YOU STEM?



The Boy Scouts of America's (BSA's) NOVA Awards program incorporates learning with cool activities and exposure to science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturers. The hope is that the requirements and activities for earning these awards stimulates interest in STEM-related fields and shows how science, technology, engineering, and mathematics apply to everyday living and the world around them. Counselors and mentors help bring this engaging, contemporary, and fun program to life for youth members.

The Nova Awards

There are four NOVA awards for Cub Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Venturers. Each award covers one component of STEM—science, technology, engineering, or mathematics.

The Supernova Awards

The Supernova awards have more rigorous requirements than the NOVA awards. The requirements and activities were designed to motivate youth and recognize more in-depth, advanced achievement in STEM-related activities.

For Boy Scouts: Dr. Bernard Harris Supernova Bronze Award Thomas Edison Supernova Silver Award

All requirements may be found in the NOVA awards guidebooks, available through local Scout shops—one for Cub Scouts, one for Boy Scouts, and one for Venturers. The requirements can be completed with a parent or an adult leader as the counselor (for the NOVA awards) or mentor (for the Supernova awards). Each guidebook includes a section for the counselor and mentor.

So, how do you do it? It's as easy as getting in touch with a mentor and taking off from there. We are offering Scouts the opportunity to take not one, but TWO STEM Topics.

We will be offering Personal Management and Nuclear Science. Personal Management will cover Design to Crunch and Nuclear Science will cover the Start Your Engines Modules. When you are done taking these sessions, you are eligible to earn the NOVA awards and a step closer to a Supernova Award.
