Where: Pipsico Scout Reservation
When: September 27-29 (Check-in will begin at 4:00 P.M. Fri.)
Cost: Early Bird: \$25.00/Scout; \$15.00/Adult
\$30.00/Person after September 6, 2019
Camporee Youth and Adult Staff, \$15.00/Person

On behalf of the Bayside Camporee Planning Committee, we welcome you to the 2019 **“Amazing Pace” Trek-O-Ree at the Pipsico Scout Reservation.** This Camporee is designed to be a Scout Patrol Event rather than a traditional Troop Camporee.

PARTICIPATION: All Scout Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts of the Bayside District of the Tidewater Council are welcome and highly encouraged to send Scout Patrols consisting of 6-8 youth and 2 adults to this Camporee. Troops are strongly encouraged to form, as may be necessary, composite patrols that are “task organized” for this event with the preferred number of youth/adult participants and with an appropriately selected Patrol Name and Patrol Flag. Scout Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts from other Districts are also invited to form Scout Patrols and attend this event. Individual Scouts and Adults may register as individual “Provisional Campers” and will be formed up by the Trek -O-Ree staff into Scout Patrols for this event. **Everyone who wants to be a Scout Trekker can participate in the Bayside Trek-O-Ree !!!**

SCOUTS --- FORM UP YOUR TREK-O-REE PATROLS NOW WITH 6-8 SCOUTS AND 2 ADULTS AND SPREAD THE WORD! You will need time to plan and prepare for this “Amazing Pace” Trek-O-Ree, and we need your Unit’s attendance & Early Bird payment by Sept 6, 2019.

DATE: September 27-29, 2019

LOCATION: Pipsico Scout Reservation, 57 Pipsico Road, Spring Grove, VA 23881.

COST: *The discount cost of registration for the full camporee is \$25.00 for Youths and \$15 for Adults on or before September 6., 2019. Registration cost is \$30.00 for Youths and Adults after September 6, 2019. Registration cost is \$15/person for Trek-O-Ree Youth and Adult Staff. All Scout Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts, as well as Provisional Campers, are also requested to notify the Trek-O-Ree Planning Committee of their Attendance Count by September 6, 2019 so we can plan properly for this GREAT Event.*

NOTE: Units which are registered and paid by September 6, 2019 may bring additional participants at the discounted registration fee rate and may also adjust their actual final payment (up or down) as advised during check-in on Friday, September 27th. **Registration closes at the end of the day on September 21st!** See “REGISTRATION” section below for important information regarding reimbursements for reductions in attendees.

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PROGRAM: The Bayside “Amazing Pace” Trek-O-Ree will be a Scout Patrol Adventure Event rather than a standard Troop Camporee. To ensure proper trail safety, capability and leadership, all participating Scout Patrols must include 6-8 Youth and 2 Adults. The Scout Patrols must have a designated Patrol Leader, Assistant Patrol Leader and Patrol Quartermaster. The Scout Patrols may be composite Patrols formed for this event rather than standard Troop Patrols, and Patrols are encouraged to include a mixture of older and new Scouts as well as current and potential Unit Adult Leaders. All Scout Patrols must have a Patrol Name and a Patrol Flag.

For this Adventure Event, Scout Patrols will TREK 7-10 miles (depending on route) in 4 segments while maintaining a SAFE but “AMAZING PACE.” (NOTE: a shorter “Star-ter Trek” will be an option for less experienced yet adventurous patrols). All Individual and Patrol gear plus food for this two night event must be “back packed” in and all trash must be carried out by the participating Scouts and Scouters – no trucks, trailers, wagons, or other beasts of burden for this event! Water and sanitation facilities will be provided at key checkpoints along the Trek.

After checking in on Friday evening, Patrols will do a final “shakedown” and review their Trek Plan. Each patrol will be assigned a camping area for Friday night, a site for Saturday lunch and a different camping area for Saturday night. Four (4) general Trek Routes to the various camp and lunch sites will be assigned at Check-In, i.e. TREK ROUTES from Check-In location to Friday night campsite ... to Saturday lunch site ... to Saturday night camp site and finally ... to Sunday morning Check-Out location. The total Trek distance will be 7-10 miles (with option for a shorter “star-ter trek”) with the Friday evening Trek not to exceed 1 mile. Patrols will need to BE PREPARED to land navigate to their various sites while “hitting” established check points along the way.

During the Trek, Patrols will have the opportunity to participate in “interesting” Scout Activities and do a short Service Project on Saturday. Scout Patrols must also BE PREPARED to encounter unplanned Challenges along their TREK route. Multiple Patrols will camp each night in the selected camp sites with “first come – first served” rights to select your preferred Patrol camping area. Saturday night camp sites will each have a Scout Spirit Camp Fire followed by a Cracker Barrel for the Patrols that successfully make it to their second campsite – others will have to shelter in the wilderness on meager rations without the benefit of a GREAT SCOUT CRACKER BARREL, i.e. FREE FOOD.

On Sunday morning, Patrols are encouraged to conduct a “Scouts’ Own” religious service before breaking camp for the final Trek to the Check-Out location. Sunday Brunch will be served at the check-out location between 10:00 AM and 11:30 AM -- no Scout or Scouter will have to ride home hungry even if a trail meal or two didn’t quite go as planned 😊

NOTE: *All Scout Patrols will need to do a planning “work up” and a gear “shakedown” (See Attached Gear Lists) prior to participating in this event to ensure that: (i) Patrol duties are properly assigned; (ii) Patrol gear is properly selected; (iv) Patrol gear is properly distributed for back packing; (v) Patrol meals are properly planned; (vi) Patrol food is properly distributed for back-packing; (vii) Individual gear is properly selected; (viii) Individual gear is properly packed; and, all Scouts and Scouters (young and old) are “Physically Strong” and prepared to complete the “Amazing Pace” Trek-O-Ree safely.*

Camp Fire and Cracker Barrel: Campfires will be held at various locations on Saturday night and the program will need to be “pulled together” by the various Patrols at each site. A Cracker Barrel will be provided after the Camp Fire – No need for Patrols to provide food for the Cracker Barrel.

Religious Services: Patrols should conduct a Scout's Own Religious Service on Sunday.

Sunday Brunch: Will be provided on Sunday from 10:00 – 11:30 AM at the Check-Out location for all participants compliments of our GREAT Award-Winning OA Cook Crew.

Awards: The **award ceremony will be held at 11:15 on Sunday** at the location of the Sunday Brunch/Check-Out. Patrols will be evaluated from Check-In to Check-Out based on Scout Spirit, Scout Skill, Scout Activities, Scout Service and their adherence to "Show No Trace" camping and the Scout Motto – **BE PREPARED!** All Patrols will receive a participation ribbon for their Unit flag. The **top three (3) Patrols will be recognized as "Amazing Pace" Patrols** with 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards. Scoring will be as noted above, and "surprise awards" may be presented based upon "hidden criteria" established by the "profoundly observant and wise" Trek-O-Ree Staff

VOLUNTEER SERVICE:

Each Patrol will have the opportunity to do a 60-90 minute service project on Saturday as part of their Trek. Details will be provided as part of each Scout Patrol Trek Plan at Check-In. Patrol members may wish to bring gloves, an axe and a saw but all other tools will be provided at the Service Project Sites.

REGISTRATION:

Online Registration: Please register and pay online using the council's online registration system at <http://tidewater.tentaroo.com> (information provided on the "ONLINE REGISTRATION FORM" attached to this guide).

Register and Pay at the Council Office: IF PAYING AT THE SCOUT OFFICE, use the form "UNIT REGISTRATION FORM" attached to this guide. Attach your check to a copy of the form. Payment should be made at the Council Service Center, 1032 Heatherwood Drive, Virginia Beach, VA 23455. Make Checks Payable to "Tidewater Council, BSA."

Reduction in Number of Attendees at Check-in: **If paying at the council office**, reimbursements due to reduction of number of attendees can be accommodated by submitting a Unit request for reimbursement through the council office. Additional information on this process will be available at the Registration Desk. **If previously paid online** using a credit card before the online registration cutoff date, the online registration system will credit the online account an amount equal to the sum of the total fees for the Scouts or Scouters removed from registration. The credit card charge will not be adjusted, and previously incurred credit card processing fees will not be reimbursed. However, the online system will automatically apply all or a portion of the credited fee amount (as appropriate to the event fees) when paying fees for future events online. If a Unit previously paid online and reductions are made after the online cutoff date, the online registration account must be adjusted manually by filling out a refund form (with "Tentaroo" written on the form) and submitting it to the Camporee Registrar for processing by the Council Office. Information on this process will be available at the Registration Desk.

IMPORTANT FOR PLANNING: *All Units are requested to notify the Camporee Planning Committee by September 6, 2019 with their count of youth/adult participants.*

ARRIVAL:

For units attending the Camporee, arrival time is between 4:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Friday, Sept 27, 2019. Please bring your roster and a copy of your registration form (your registration receipt if registering and paying online). If you have additions to your roster, please have checks made out to "Tidewater Council, BSA" Please turn in a copy of your Unit Registration Sheet and Roster at check-in.

NOTE: Only the Adult Leader in charge should come to the registration table with the required paperwork. All other members of the unit will be directed to their "shakedown" site.

PIPSICO MAPS: See attached Map showing the Pipsico address and driving directions. Trek Maps will be provided to each Scout Patrol at Check-In.

PARKING:

General Parking and Check-In will be at the Gregson Center. All vehicles and trailers must be loaded/offloaded in the designated parking areas. All unit and individual gear, food and water must be back-packed along the established Trek routes. Requests for exceptions will be considered on a case by case basis.

CAMPSITES:

The Trek-O-Ree site will be laid out with predesignated Patrol Trek routes and campsites as discussed above under "Program." Specific camp areas will be selected within the designated campsite by each Scout Patrol on a "first come- first served" basis. Patrol Trek Plans with campsite designations will be provided upon Check-In.

GENERAL RULES/GUIDELINES: All Scouts, Scouters and visitors must adhere to the following:

1. The Scout Oath and Law
2. The Outdoor Code
3. The Guide to Safe Scouting

Additionally, the following rules must be followed:

1. Sheath knives, fireworks, pets, firearms, electronic games, radios, TV's and other electronic entertainment are NOT permitted.
2. Unit leaders are responsible for their Scouts and visitors. The "Buddy Rule" will be in effect. Scouts are not permitted to roam individually through the campsites during the scheduled program activities.
3. Scouts are not permitted to leave the Trek-O-Ree site(s) unless moving with their unit.
4. Excessive noise or activities are not allowed.
5. Units moving along roadways must walk in no more than two columns.
6. A Scout is Clean – **each unit should come prepared to provide hand washing/sanitizing capability within their campsites** and, to minimize wastewater, each participant should also bring their own individual hand sanitizer.

LEADERSHIP: All unit leaders are responsible for the conduct of their personnel and any visitors. Two-deep leadership (in compliance with Youth Protection Guidelines and the Guide to Safe Scouting) is required at all times. One adult must be present in the unit campsite at all times. Units are encouraged to involve Parents and other Adults as the second Adult Leader in each Scout Patrol as a way of encouraging and recruiting new Adult Scouters.

UNIFORMS: Complete official BSA uniforms are authorized but not required for this event. However, Scout Patrols should present a uniformed appearance with appropriate Scout pants/shorts and T-shirt.

Note: No open toe shoes are permitted. This includes all participants, visitors, staff and leaders, both youth and adults.

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SCOUT CONDUCT: It is important that all youth and adults conduct themselves in a Scout-like manner throughout the Trek-O-Ree. Excessive loud noise will not be tolerated. It is the unit's responsibility to ensure the proper conduct of their members.

RECRUITING: The Trek-O-Ree is a great opportunity to recruit new youth and adults and to train new Scouts. Interested youth (Scout BSA age) and adults who wish to experience the fun of Scouting, are welcome to register with a Troop and camp with them. **Units should use this event as a recruiting tool and have Scouts invite their friends to sign up and come to the Trek-O-Ree.**

MEDICAL SERVICES: All units should bring a unit first aid kit and treat injuries within their capabilities. Units must report all injuries and other medical situations to the Camporee staff, even those they treat themselves. EMTs will be on site and available to handle any situation that cannot be handled within the unit. Unit leaders are expected to control all medications within their units.

CAMPSITE SET-UP: Scout Patrols should set up their campsite with their Patrol name and flag. Trek-O-Ree Staff will inspect/judge campsites each morning using the attached inspection sheet. As Units work to set an "AMAZING PACE," it is very important that campsites are neatly maintained throughout the event. Staff inspectors will be looking for Patrols to set up model "squared away" campsites; properly assign Patrol Duties, Prepare Properly Cooked and Wholesome Trail Meals; and "Leave No Trace" upon departure. Open wood cooking fires in properly prepared "off-the-ground" fire pits/rings may be allowed in certain campsites; however, Scout Patrols should be prepared to cook using trail-size propane/butane stoves.

FIRES and COOKING:

Units must post their own fire plan which will be inspected for proper fire safety. Open fires will be restricted to designated fire pits/rings.

LATRINES: Port-a-Pots will be available in specific locations within the camp and activity areas.

TRASH DISPOSAL: Dumpsters will be provided for Trek-O-Ree use at selected locations along the Trek routes. All participants should practice Leave No Trace principles to the maximum extent possible.

FOOD: Each unit will provide their own food for meals with the following exceptions: The Trek-O-Ree will provide the food for a Saturday night cracker barrel and a camp-wide Brunch Sunday morning - --- so plan accordingly.

WATER: Water will be available at a designated water points. The water source is only for filling Patrol water carriers. Washing of dishes, playing in the water point area or any other activity except filling water containers is prohibited.

PATCHES/RIBBONS: All registered participants will receive the Trek-O-Ree patch. Patrols will receive Ribbons to place on their unit flagpole and will be recognized for the honor(s) they receive from scoring at the Trek-O-Ree. Patches and ribbons will be distributed to units following check out and once the unit has turned in at least one evaluation sheet. Extra patches may be ordered at the council office for \$3.00 each on or before August 31, 2019.

TAPS/LIGHTS OUT: A Scout is Courteous. Taps is at 11:00 p.m. Unit leaders must ensure that fires and lanterns are out, and all youths are quietly in their tents. Quiet hours extend until 6:00am.

BAD WEATHER: BE PREPARED. All units should prepare for foul weather by planning and preparing for heat, rain, wind and/or cold. See available training in e-training, my Scouting.

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RELIGIOUS SERVICES: A Scout is Reverent. A non-denominational, non-sectarian Scout's Own Service should be held Sunday morning by the Participating Patrols at each campsite. Scouts and Scouters need not wear a Class A uniform to the service. Please attend this event and help your fellow Scouts as they fulfill the requirement for their religious emblem and as leaders fulfill requirements for their training. A Scout is Courteous. Since this service is a field services, all other activities in the campsite will stop to reduce noise. You may not feel you need to attend this service, but the service is extremely important to those attending.

FEEDBACK: Patrols are requested to provide constructive feedback to the staff at the conclusion of the event. Please complete the attached Camporee Evaluation Form and return it to the check-out person upon exit. Evaluation forms are to be filled out by youth and adults. At least one feedback form must be turned-in by each Patrol to receive the Camporee patch. These forms will help us continue to improve our program.

CHECK-OUT: All units must depart no later than 1:00 pm Sunday, September 29th. When ready for check-out, please send a representative from the unit to the staff Check-Out location to request a final check-out inspection. Patrols will receive their patches upon successful completion of the inspection and once a feedback form is turned-in. Vehicles and Trailers may be moved for loading to the Brunch/Awards/Check-Out site (on space available basis). Units will not be allowed to pack out or load vehicles/trailers during the closing award ceremonies.

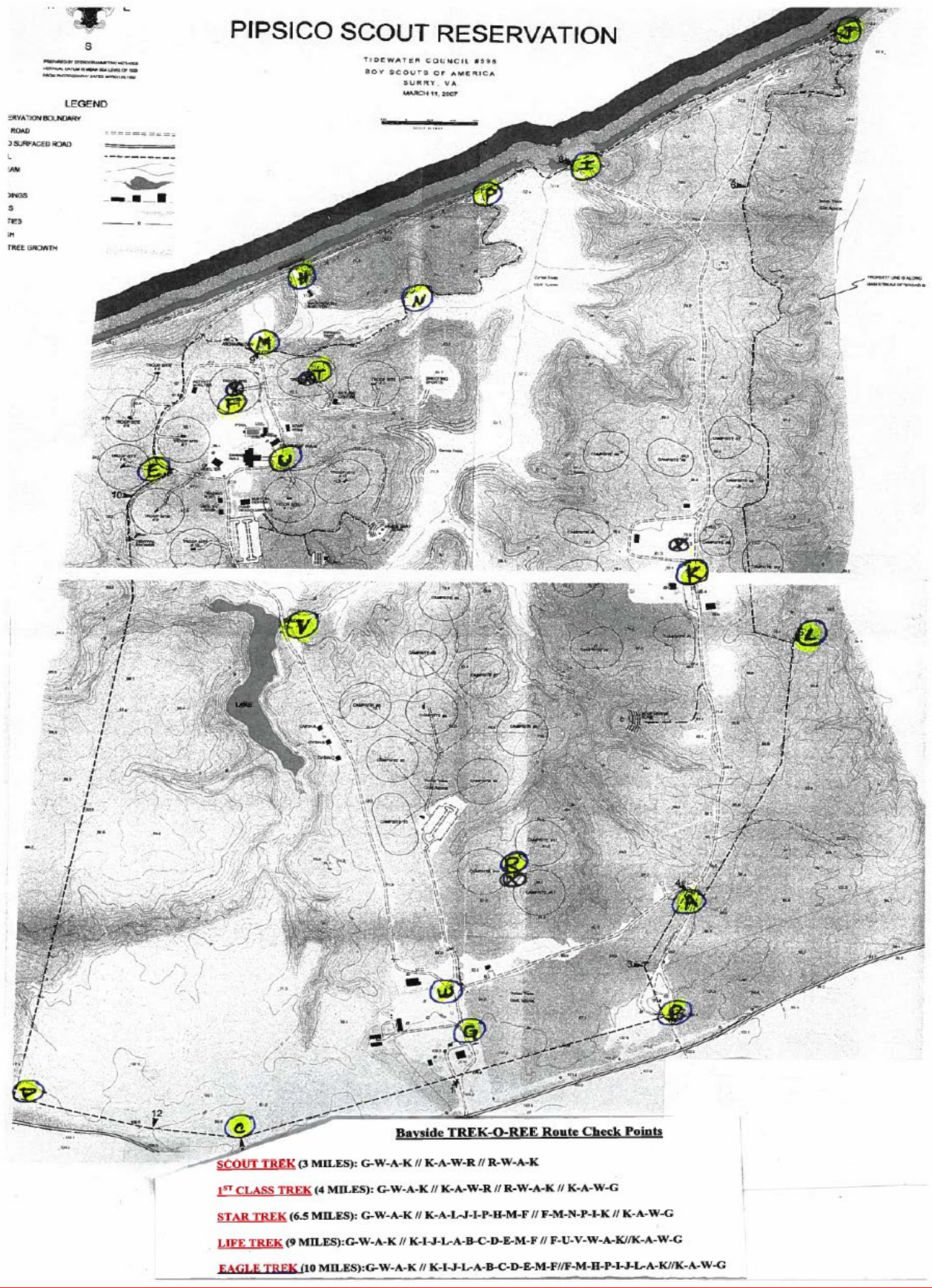
How do I get to Pipsico?
