WHAT IS CUB SCOUT LEADER POW WOW?

Pow Wow is a supplemental, action-packed training event for adult Cub Scout Leaders, Pack Committee Members, Charter Organization Representatives, parents of Cub Scouts and Cub Scout-interested persons. You'll spend the day learning new ideas and concepts and having hands-on experiences that will enhance your ability to deliver and support a fun-filled, exciting program to Cub Scout boys.

WHEN AND WHERE IS POW WOW?

Pow Wow will be held Saturday, October 28, 2017 at Portsmouth Catholic Regional School, 2301 Oregon Avenue, Portsmouth, VA. Please refer to map & directions included. Doors open at 7:15 am (please, no early arrivals) with pre-registered package pick-up in the gymnasium. Opening ceremony begins at 7:45 am. The first training session starts at 8:00 am. Pow Wow will end after the Closing and Awards session which will start at 12 noon.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND POW WOW?

All registered adult Cub Scout Leaders, potential leaders, and interested parents. This includes: Cubmasters and their Assistants; Tiger Den Leaders and their Assistants and partners; Wolf, Bear, and Webelos Den Leaders and their Assistants; Pack Committee members and activity/event chairpersons; and anyone who wants to learn more about how to have a better Cub Scout program. Oh! And let's not forget Charter Organization Representatives, they need to come too.

Training sessions will be offered on relevant topics for every Cub Scout position and are designed to help you make your Cub Scout program more fun for the boys ... and for you too!

Pow Wow is a half-day adult training event and the course sessions are intended for adults only. Unfortunately, we do not have provisions or accommodations for watching children and/or daycare. The day is just for adults. Thank You!



HOW MUCH DOES POW WOW COST AND WHAT'S INCLUDED?

Pre-register, on-line by October 20, 2017 and register for only \$15.00. Online registration will close after midnight on October 20, 2017. Walk-in registrations <u>WILL NOT</u> be accepted at the event, so please register early!

The pre-registration fee includes a half-day of training for as many as four courses, an event patch, a Pow Wow Binder with all sorts of nifty information in it, and as much Scout fellowship, spirit, and networking you can take-in during the day!!

Start on Battlefield Blvd. Merge onto VA-168 towards I-464 N. Take Exit 6A to merge onto I-264 W towards Portsmouth. Take Exit 4 onto VA-337 W Portsmouth Blvd. Make a slight right onto Airline Blvd. and turn left onto King's Highway. Destination is on the right. Toll Required.

DIRECTIONS: (FROM COUNCIL SERVICE CENTER)

Start on Wesleyan Drive. Turn left onto Northhampton Blvd. Keep right to merge onto I-64 E towards Downtown Norfolk & Chesapeake. Take Exit 284-A onto I-264 W towards Norfolk & Portsmouth. Take Exit 4 onto VA-337 W Portsmouth Blvd. Take a slight right onto Airline Blvd. and turn left onto King's Highway. Destination is on the right. Toll Required.

HOW TO SELECT CLASSES WITH ONLINE REGISTRATION

After you have entered your registration information, at the bottom left of the screen you'll see this button:

A Continue to Pick Options

Click it and you'll come to this page where you select your classes. To choose a class (note the session number to the right of each class choice), just drag it to the left side of the screen. Once you select an option from a session number, the right side will no longer show any choices for that session. Continue dragging right to left until you fill out your class schedule. To change your mind, just drag from left to right and options for that session will reappear on the right for you to choose from.


View All Options

Adult Recognition (101)	Show your leaders and parents how much you care by recognizing them with certificates, plaques, and other tokens of appreciation. Make sure a deserving leader doesn't miss out on an opportunity to add a knot to their uniform.		
Campfires for Cubs	Learn the steps for planning a successful campfire program with songs, skits, stories, and run-ons. What if you can't have an open flame? Don't let that stop you from having a campfire! Learn how to create an exciting outdoor and indoor campfire program that leaves your audience wanting more!		
Ceremonies (103)	Fun and unique ideas for advancements and recognition. Create a memorable moment for the Scout, parent, and leader with a few simple props. Add some sparkle and pizzazz to your den and pack meetings:		
Chest of Games	A good leader always has a game in their back pocket for just those moments. Leaders will learn simple games, and what type of games work best for gathering activities, small or large groups, and team building.		
Cooking with Cubs	Everything from box cooking to Dutch Oven cooking; learn different ways to teach Cub Scouts to cook outdoors.		
Den Dynamics (106)	What makes a good den? Along with the basics of den structure, we will focus on how a successful den starts off and bonds the Scouts. We'll show you how to help your Scouts take ownership of the den and some of the successes and failures along the way.
