



Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS)

In this hands-on course, adult leaders work together as a patrol and learn the practical skills they need to lead Scouts in the outdoors. IOLS course builds and expands on the concepts and themes introduced in Scoutmaster Position-Specific Training. Upon completion, leaders will feel comfortable teaching Scouts the basic skills required to obtain the First Class rank. Along with Scoutmaster Specific Training, this course is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be "position-trained".
