

KEVIN GREENE

Kevin Greene was inducted into the National Football League's Hall of Fame in 2016. A member of the NFL's All-Decade Team of the 1990s, he played in six conference championship games and one Super Bowl.

He led his team in sacks 11 times during his career, amassing a total of 160, ranking him third all-time when he retired after the 1999 season. He also had three safeties, five interceptions, and 26 fumble recoveries.

Greene was selected first-team All-Pro three times (1989, 1994, 1996). He was named to the NFL Pro Bowl five times (once with the Los Angeles Rams, and twice each with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Carolina Panthers).



He got his first sack as a rookie in the playoffs. In his second season, he reached seven sacks, and added another 6.5 sacks in 1987. By his fourth season, Greene had turned into a bona fide pass rusher, registering a career-high 16.5 sacks. This included a career-best 4.5 sacks in a 38-16 win over the San Francisco 49ers in the season finale, which clinched a playoff berth for the Rams. The following year, Greene again turned in 16.5 sacks.

In all, Greene registered double-digit sack totals 10 times, ranking him second in the NFL record book at the time. He recorded at least 10 sacks in each of his final eight seasons in the league, with one exception. In 1995, he had a team-leading nine sacks for the Steelers.

After his Hall of Fame professional football season ended, Greene embarked on a 16-year U.S. Army Reserve career, serving as a captain. He drilled and attended the Jr. Officer Maintenance Course (JMOC) and the Tank Commander Certification Course (TC3) at Fort Knox, Kentucky. As a U.S. Army Paratrooper, he attended Airborne school at Ft. Benning, Georgia.

Greene earned the rank of Eagle Scout with the Boy Scouts of America in 1978. He and his wife, Tara, live in Florida and have two children, Gavin and Gabrielle.
