### COVID-19 Guidance for Tidewater Council Units Chartered in Virginia

As of April 1, 2021, Virginia's Governor Northam has adjusted COVID-19 restrictions in relation to group gatherings:

*All public and private in-person gatherings of more than 50 individuals indoors and 100 individuals outdoors are prohibited. A "gathering" includes, but is not limited to, parties, celebrations, or other social events, whether they occur indoors or outdoors.*

-Executive Order Fourth Amended Number Seventy-Two (2021)

We have confirmed with the Virginia Department of Health this restriction applies to Scout unit meetings and activities.

Tidewater Council provides the following guidance for adhering to this restriction:

1. Continue to consult with your adult committee and chartered organization regarding all in-person unit meetings and activities.
2. Familiarize yourself with local and state COVID-19 requirements.
3. Employ general COVID-19 protocols as part of all Scouting meetings/activities:
  - a. Everyone five years of age and above present at the activity wears a face covering.
  - b. Wash hands and sanitize surfaces and equipment frequently.
  - c. Maintain appropriate distance (at least 6 feet) at all times.
  - d. Take participant temperatures before participation.
  - e. Advise participants to stay home if they are sick.
4. If your unit's total participant count (including youth members, adult leaders, and family members) exceeds fifty, take steps to be compliant with the restriction on gathering size:
  - a. Conduct meetings that do not require the full unit to gather together.
  - b. When you do have meetings with the full group, hold them via teleconference.
  - c. It is acceptable to hold meetings in smaller groups, such as dens or patrols, provided:
    - i. Each group has their own space to meet.
    - ii. The groups do not intermingle.
    - iii. The full group does not assemble at any time.
    - iv. Each group has two-deep leadership.
  - d. If you have enough leadership, consider having smaller groups meet at separate times on the same day or on different days.
  - e. Meet outdoors (weather permitting), where it is easier to maintain social distancing.

We understand this fifty-person limit may be an obstacle for many large Scout units, particularly when planning full meetings or activities. It is important to find ways to continue to provide the Scouting experience while ensuring the safety of our Scouts, leaders, families, and community.
