






MEMBERSHIP



PERSEVERING THROUGH COVID

ADVANCEMENT



CUB SCOUTS

- Cub Scouting offers boys and girls the opportunity to advance through several ranks that coincide with grades K-5.
- In 2021, 536 Cub Scouts earned their Bobcat badge, the first rank for all new Cubs regardless of age.
- 121 Lion (kindergarten) badges were earned, with 187 Tiger (1st grade), 207 Wolf (2nd grade), 227 Bear (3rd grade), and 299 Webelos (4th grade) badges.
- 256 Cub Scouts earned the Arrow of Light, the culmination of the program.

SCOUTS BSA

- In 2021, 150 council youth achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. Of these, ten were young women, including the inaugural class of seven.
- A total of 5,741 merit badges were earned in 2021.
- The top five merit badges earned were First Aid, Citizenship in the World, Swimming, Citizenship in the Nation, and Environmental Science.



OTHER RECOGNITION



- The National Eagle Scout Association recognized two Outstanding Eagle Scouts in our council: Kent Glover and Bret Fisher.
- Emmett Moorhouse represented our council for the National Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year.

PRODUCT SALES



RECORD SALES

In 2021, Tidewater Council Scouts sold more than \$955,000 in popcorn.

That performance is an increase of 12.8% over the 2019 sales season and 52.9% over the 2020 sales season.

MILITARY SUPPORT

Tidewater Council Scouts collected nearly **\$60,000** in military donations during the 2021 popcorn sale.

These donations provided morale-boosting treats to our servicemen and women through partnerships with the USO of Hampton Roads and Central Virginia and other military support organizations.





IMPACT

Scouting units earned more than \$375,000 in commissions, funding the local Scouting program and lowering costs for families.

Popcorn sales also taught Scouts the value of earning their own way and life skills, including salesmanship, public speaking, and how to set and achieve goals.

CHARTERED ORGANIZATIONS



FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS

- "A Scout is Reverent" is the 12th Point of the Scout Law.
- Many churches have gained new members by chartering a unit.
- Currently, there are 111 faith-based organizations sponsoring Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, or Venturing crews in Tidewater Council.

CIVIC/FRATERNAL ORGANIZATIONS

- Every national civic and fraternal organization has local chapters that sponsor Scouting units.
- Like them, Scouting works to guide youth to grow as leaders to ensure strong families, communities, and our nation through service projects.
- Currently, there are 21 faith-based organizations sponsoring Cub Scout, Scouts BSA, or Venturing crews in Tidewater Council.





BUSINESS-BASED ORGANIZATIONS

- The Scouting program provides positive development activities for today's youth.
- Eight local businesses charter Scout units in Tidewater Council; some offer on-the-job training for youth members.
