- 3. Learn about the who, what, when, where of your pack.
- 4. Learn how to get involved at your meetings.
- 5. Attend a campout with your pack as soon as possible.

2ND & 3RD GRADE

- · Adult participation as needed.
- · Weekly meetings led by den leaders.
- Den meetings focus on learning new skills using games, projects, crafts, and basic outdoor skills.
- Work toward achieving the Wolf or Bear Badge of rank.



4TH & 5TH GRADE

- · Adult participation as needed.
- · Weekly meetings led by den leaders.
- Den meetings focus on activity pin advancements and outdoor activities.
- Work toward achieving the Webelos Badge and Arrow of Light rank.
 Prepare youth for Scouts BSA.



Earn Awards and Badges

On the advancement trail, a Cub Scout progresses from rank to rank. All the requirements to earn these awards are in the Scout's handbook.

As Scouts advance, the requirements become more challenging, to match their new skills and abilities. Cub Scout Adventures are completed as a den, pack, and family.

Scouts receive these awards at pack meetings and the pack's annual Blue and Gold Banquet.



KINDERGARTEN

- Youth sign up with an adult partner. (Adult is required.)
- Usually meet twice per month.
- Work on achievements and family activities in the Lion Adventure Book.



1ST GRADE

- Youth sign up with an adult partner. (Adult is required.)
- Usually meet weekly or twice per month, and go on field trips and outings.
- Works on special recognitions through fun family activities.

How Cub Scouting Works



Your child is a member of a **DEN**, consisting of 6-8 youth, similar in age or grade, who typically meet weekly with two **DEN LEADERS**. All of the dens make up the **CUB SCOUT PACK**.

PACKS typically meet monthly with the **CUBMASTER**, with other **DENS** and families in attendance. **PACK** meeting have fun activities, recognition, and the opportunity to engage with other **DENS**.

Your PACK is part of TIDEWATER COUNCIL, BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, which serves

families throughout southeastern Virginia and northeastern North Carolina.

Leaders Spend Quality Time with their Children

Parent volunteers make the pack thrive.

DEN LEADER/ASSISTANT DEN LEADER:Leads the den at weekly den and monthly pack meetings. Attends the monthly pack leaders meeting.

PACK COMMITTEE: Performs administrative functions of the pack, including treasurer, secretary, fundraising, advancement, and other behind- the-scenes support.

For the safety of your child, all adult volunteers must complete a detailed adult application with a criminal background check. All leaders are required to complete BSA's Youth Protection Training, and meet all other BSA standards of leadership.

Youth participate in many fun projects, including the Pinewood Derby. Cub Scouts design and build small wooden cars to race on an inclined track.

This is a great opportunity for youth to work with their parents or other adults in the pack to construct a race car and compete in the race.



Helping Our Community

Service projects are one way Cub Scouts help other people.

Scouts learn to work together and to do something good for our community.

Activities may include: conducting flag ceremonies, collecting food for food banks, cleaning litter in a park, or other age-appropriate tasks.

Pack Campouts and Activities
