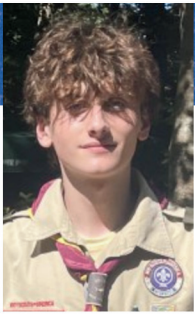

# EAGLE SCOUT SERVICE PROJECT OF 2025

## CHRISTOPHER BEALE



For his Eagle Scout project, Christopher Beale of Troop 364 led the installation of a rain garden and vegetated swale at Foundry United Methodist Church in Virginia Beach to address ongoing flooding and stormwater runoff issues. Surrounded by impervious concrete surfaces that redirects water onto the church property, the site frequently experiences pooling and runoff that carries debris into local storm drains and waterways.

Christopher's project centered on redirecting stormwater into a 20' x 20' rain garden. When full, excess water flows through a planted swale where native trees and perennials help absorb and filter runoff before it reaches the drain.



He designed, and recruited five volunteers to construct, an 8-foot wooden bridge, to be placed over the swale to provide a safe pedestrian passage and prevent vehicles from driving across the area.

After Lynnhaven River NOW completed excavation through grant funding, Christopher organized the rain garden and tree-planting phase. He led 43 volunteers to place soil and rock, plant 20 8-foot trees, install more than 200 native non-invasive plants, spread mulch, and position the bridge. He coordinated logistics, ensured all volunteers had roles, and emphasized safety throughout the project.

This sustainable solution will help prevent property damage, reduce polluted runoff, and protect the area's surrounding watershed for years to come.

The National Eagle Scout Association has established the Glenn A. and Melinda W. Adams National Eagle Scout Service Project of the Year Award to recognize valuable service of an exceptional nature by a Scout to a religious institution, a school, community, or other entity.

This national award recognizes the Scout for their Eagle Scout service project. Each local council chooses a council-level winner; Council Service Territory 15 (CST 15) will pick a CST-level winner from that pool. A national winner will be selected from the pool of CST 1 through CST 16 finalists.

# TIDEWATER COUNCIL SALUTES

Eagle Scout is the highest achievement and rank attainable in Scouting America's Scouts BSA program. The designation "Eagle Scout" was initiated in 1912. Since then, almost 2.8 million young men and women have earned the Eagle Scout rank.

Eagle Scout requirements include earning at least 21 merit badges — 14 of which were required in 2025. After a lengthy review process, fewer than six percent of all Scouts earn this rank.

The Eagle Scout candidate must demonstrate Scout Spirit, an ideal attitude based on the Scout Oath and Law, leadership, and service. The requirements include completing a large-scale service project they plan, organize, lead, and manage.

### NESA OUTSTANDING EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

#### TODD T. CORILLO

Todd Corillo began his Scouting journey with Cub Scout Pack 481 in Virginia Beach and continued with Troop 419 at Kings Grant Presbyterian Church. In 2005, he earned the rank of Eagle Scout, becoming the third of four Corillo brothers to achieve Scouting's highest honor. All four brothers completed Eagle Scout projects benefiting the M.E. Cox Center for Elder Day Care in Virginia Beach.

A graduate of William & Mary, Corillo followed in his parents' footsteps into broadcast journalism. His career included stops in Staunton and Harrisonburg before returning home to Norfolk. For a decade, he anchored broadcasts at WTKR/WGNT and served as the lead military reporter in the nation's most defense-concentrated media market, covering the men and women who serve.

After earning his MBA, Corillo began a new chapter in 2022, joining HII, the nation's largest shipbuilder, as corporate manager of media relations. In that role, he supports communications efforts across the country and internationally, highlighting the workforce that delivers critical capabilities to the U.S. Department of War and allied partners.

Corillo remains active in service to his community, supporting the Tidewater Council as an event emcee and volunteering with the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank. He is a longtime mentor in the American Corporate Partners (ACP) program, a national nonprofit that helps veterans and active-duty military spouses find their next careers. He also stays active in local intramural sports, captaining teams and competing in pickleball, kickball, volleyball, bowling, and dodgeball.

He credits his parents, Glenn and Marilyn Corillo, for their steadfast support and for instilling the values of leadership, service, and integrity through Scouting.

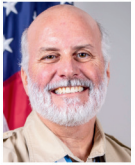

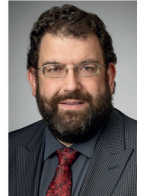

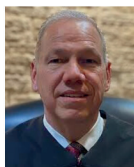

## NESSA OUTSTANDING EAGLE SCOUT AWARD



### DAVID W. LANNETTI

Dave Lannetti began his Scouting adventure as a Cub Scout in Pack 172 in Warrington, Pennsylvania. He received his Arrow of Light in 1970 and crossed over into Troop 172, which had a reputation as “the canoeing troop.” He quickly ascended the Boy Scout ranks, soaking up Scouting principles (while frequently canoeing) and earning the Eagle Scout rank in 1973 at the age of 13. He went on to receive the Bronze, Gold, and Silver Eagle Palms.

He was elected to the Order of the Arrow, was an Ordeal and Brotherhood member of Ajapeu Lodge #33, and served as a Chapter Vice Chief. He also served on summer camp staff at Ockanickon Scout Reservation in Bucks County.

Dave went on to graduate from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1981 and was selected by Admiral Hyman Rickover to receive nuclear engineering training and serve on nuclear submarines. While in the Navy, he was heavily involved as a Scout leader in Norfolk with his two sons, serving in Pack 24 as Tiger Cub Leader, Den Leader, Webelos Leader, and Cubmaster.

When his sons joined Troop 24, he served as a Troop Committee Member and Assistant Scoutmaster. Dave went to Philmont Scout Reservation with each of his sons, serving as the Council Contingent Leader in 2004 during an 85-mile trek and the Troop 24 Contingent Leader in 2016 during a 55-mile trek (with his wife, Kami, as another adult leader). Both of his sons went on to become Eagle Scouts. Dave and Kami also established Venturing Crew 24, which included two of their daughters, and served as Crew Advisors.

After retiring from the Navy, Dave went to law school and, upon graduation, practiced law in Norfolk. He has remained active in Scouting, serving on the Tidewater Council Executive Board for the past 18 years, including on several committees and as the National Eagle Scout Association Representative. He completed Wood Badge training in 2007 (as a Bobwhite) and went on to serve as a staff member during several Wood Badge courses, culminating in his service as Wood Badge Course Director in 2012.

Dave has also been a very active member of Larchmont United Methodist Church (the chartering organization for Pack 24, Troop 24, and Crew 24) for decades and has served as its Chartered Organization Representative for many years. He regularly organized the annual Scout Sunday service, usually providing the sermon himself.

He has been recognized for his contributions and service with, among others, the James E. West Fellowship Award, the William D. Boyce Award, the Powhatan District Crew Leader of the Year Award, the Silver Beaver Award, and the Tidewater Council “Living Legend” Award.

In 2014, Dave was elected by the General Assembly to serve as a Circuit Court Judge in the City of Norfolk, where he continues to serve. In his spare time, he serves on law-related committees and boards at the local, state, and national levels; is an adjunct professor at both William & Mary Law School and Regent University School of Law; coaches Special Olympics athletes; and recruits for the U.S. Naval Academy. The Scout Oath and Law have been—and continue to be—guiding principles in his life.

### NESA OUTSTANDING EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

#### JOEL R. NIED

Joel Nied was a Cub Scout in Pack 14 in Jacksonville, Florida, (North Florida Council) where he earned his Arrow of Light. He continued his Scouting journey with Troop 12 in Jacksonville, which Ahavath Chesed Synagogue chartered. Joel became a Brotherhood member of the Echokotee Lodge of the Order of the Arrow. In 1984, he went to Philmont, and in 1986, he earned the rank of Eagle Scout.

Joel is an attorney whose practice focuses on corporate and securities matters, mergers and acquisitions, debt and equity financings, and intellectual property. Joel also has extensive experience handling transactions involving debt and equity financings, joint ventures, licensing agreements, engineering services contracts, executive employment and compensation, development agreements, and supply agreements. His practice is industry-agnostic, serving government contractors, real estate portfolio owners, and software developers. Joel graduated from the University of Pennsylvania and the Emory University School of Law. Joel has been named to the Best Lawyers in America, Super Lawyers, and a *Virginia Lawyers Weekly* Go-To Lawyer for Business Law.

Joel has served as a Lone Scout Friend and Counselor since 2020, when his two sons and daughter joined Scouting. All of his children are Eagle Scouts. In 2020, Joel helped the Tidewater Council stand up Virginia's first "Award Center" for the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award. He has served as the Award Leader of the Award Center since then. He currently serves on Tidewater Council's Executive Council. Last year, he was the Friends of Scouting Chair for the Bayside District. This year, he is the co-chair of the Tidewater Council's Leadership Breakfast.

In addition to volunteering with Scouting, Joel has served on a variety of local not-for-profit boards, including the Entrepreneurs Forum of Hampton Roads and the Hospice and Palliative Care of Tidewater, as well as the boards of for-profit companies. In 2024, he received his commission to the Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Virginia Commonwealth University Health System Authority.

# NESA DISTINGUISHED EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

## JOHN M. SCHEIB



Scouting America Tidewater Council's John Scheib, a member of the Eagle Scout class of 1986, has been selected by the National Eagle Scout Association (NESA) to receive its highest Eagle Scout honor – the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award.

John was the first Eagle Scout in Troop 25 (Waynesboro, VA). As an adult, he served as an Eagle Scout mentor in Troop 419 and as a founding assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 5587, both in Virginia Beach. He also served as an assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 587 in Virginia Beach.

John is the proud father of two Eagle Scouts – Will and Ava. In 2023, he was honored as a recipient of the NESA Outstanding Eagle Scout Award by Tidewater Council, the fifth-oldest Scouting America council in the United States, established in 1911.

Today, John serves as president of the Tidewater Council, which serves more than 4,000 youth and their families through 1,700 adult volunteers in the Virginia cities of Chesapeake, Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Virginia Beach and the North Carolina counties of Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Pasquotank, and Perquimans.

John is a Vigil Honor member of the Order of the Arrow (OA), Scouting America's honor society. He has served as a Chapter Advisor and Associate Lodge Advisor in Tidewater Council's OA Blue Heron Lodge, as a Host Lodge Advisor, and as a Shows Advisor for several Section SR-7A Conclaves. He was on the training staff at the 2018 and 2020 National OA Conferences.

Blue Heron Lodge bestowed John with the Silver Heron Award in 2016, the same year in which his son, Will, received it. The Silver Heron Award is presented to no more than two members of the lodge each year. It recognizes individuals who best exemplify cheerful service in their local lodge, chapter, unit, and beyond Scouting.

He is a Wood Badge Eagle and a two-time graduate of Scouting America's National Camp School. He has volunteered at summer camp for nine summers, even delaying a new career position to volunteer as the Tidewater Council's Pipsico Scout Reservation Camping Director for a summer (2021). He later took summer vacations in 2022 and 2023, and part of 2024, to reprise that role.

During his tenure, youth attendance at Pipsico grew 35%. In 2025, Scheib authored a book about his experiences as a camp director, *Awesomeness: Secrets to Camp Success*.

He is a partner at Gentry Locke Attorneys, having previously served as a senior leader at Norfolk Southern Corporation. He has been recognized multiple times as a member of the Virginia Legal Elite.

John holds a B.A. in American Government from the University of Virginia and a J.D., magna cum laude, with the Order of the Coif (which recognizes the top 10% of graduating law students for academic achievement), from Villanova University School of Law, where he served on the Villanova Law Review.

# NESSA DISTINGUISHED EAGLE SCOUT AWARD

## SCOUTING AMERICA TIDEWATER COUNCIL HONOREES



The Distinguished Eagle Scout Award (DESA) was established in 1969 to acknowledge Eagle Scouts who have received national-level recognition, fame, or eminence within their field and have a strong record of voluntary service to their community. It is the National Eagle Scout Association (NESA)'s highest honor. Only those who earned the Eagle Scout rank at least 25 years previously are eligible for nomination.

Previous recipients include President Gerald R. Ford, several governors and senators, military flag officers, university presidents, chief executives of Fortune 500 companies, and nationally known lawyers, journalists, creatives, educators, scientists, and doctors.

Recipients are selected by the DESA Award Committee, which comprises members who are also DESA recipients. Only a small percentage of nominations are approved.



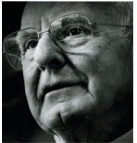
